



Ambition Lawrence Weston plans to build a communityowned wind turbine

Back in the summer of 2016 at Lawrence Weston Carnival some of you may remember us asking you for your support for renewable energy and to develop a community-owned wind turbine providing revenue back to the community. This received overwhelming support with 97% of 130 Lawrence Weston residents surveyed, surveys at other events with residents have also shown the same high level

of support. This has led to us forming a project and identifying funding and planning routes to achieve this and have continued to gain your support to develop the project with Port Communities Resilience Funding which many of you voted for this project.

I am pleased to say that we have continued to develop the project with further funding support from Bristol City Council and Power to Change and are now in the position of preparing to submit a planning application for the largest onshore wind turbine in Bristol which will support the delivery of the Community Plan.

We, therefore, invite all Lawrence Weston residents to drop in your Youth and Community Centre, Long Cross BS11 ORX to find out more about our plans and show your support once again to enable us to successfully achieve planning permission and realise a community asset for you. The project will provide long-term revenue to support Ambition Lawrence Weston's community plan and pioneer an innovative approach to unlocking an onshore wind development that can be replicated by other communities. 
For those who aren't familiar with the club, we are a registered charity established to give young people further opportunities of increasing their potential through effective use of their leisure time.

Growing on and on......Gardening talk and tips

September and October are my favourite months of the year. Autumn fruits make great picking – raspberries, blackberries, apples and pears. If you are lucky enough and you can beat the squirrels, you can also pick hazelnuts from the hedgerows. And of course elderberries (though this year these are long gone having fruited early) and rose hips for making cordial. Many of these trees grow wild in the Saltmarsh Green Space area – well worth a walk on a sunny autumn morning. Another great thing about this time of year is saving your own seed. Now is the time to scan your garden and other gardens (with permission of course!) for poppy

heads, nasturtium seeds, holly hocks and foxgloves. Dry the seeds and label them ready to sow next spring. My granddad was a gardener – and he always had a pocket full of seeds and cuttings collected from every walk he went on!



As the ground is still warm, this is a good time of year to plant trees, shrubs and perennials. Throw some rotted manure in the hole first and water well. If you have plants in containers /pots fill the gaps with some winter and spring flowering plants. Winter pansies, cyclamen and ivy look attractive in the winter, with some forget-me-nots and wall flowers for the spring. Blaise Nursery has a selection and is open 7th–25th October: 10am to 4pm including weekends. Lawns — any areas left un-mown to encourage wildlife, can now be mown down. If you have the energy, using a garden fork to put holes into the ground will help drainage and improve growth next year. This is a great time to start feeding the wild birds as their food sources become scarcer. Watching birds on a feeder is mesmerising for all ages — get the kids involved by filling up feeders with sunflower seeds.

Kerry's Plant(s) of the month

Autumn colour is one of the only good things about losing hours of daylight – there are many street and garden trees that turn beautiful colours in Lawrence Weston. Another wonderful tree is the Quince – you can see one of these in the farm's orchard. With its large furry pear shaped fruits (delicious cooked with honey) and its large leaves it is an attractive and productive tree.

"Alive! Lawrence Weston Community Garden" has secured another years worth of funding from the National Lottery Community Fund.

Alive! are excited to announce the continuation and development of the Lawrence Weston Community Gardening group.

For 2 years, Alive ran free, accessible horticultural therapy sessions from The Bungalow on the corner of Ridingleaze, Lawrence Weston. In November 2018 the Community Garden moved to Blaise Weston Court. We have since dug new vegetable beds and begun developing the lovely new wheelchair accessible gardening spaces in the grounds. We have a polytunnel for starting off seedlings and all resources are provided. This includes gloves, as well as specially adapted lightweight and long-reach tools, ensuring gardening remains accessible for those with mobility or dexterity issues.

We get stuck into a range of outdoor vegetable, fruit and flower growing as well as a variety of green-craft indoor activities, so the sessions run in all weathers, with our trained green-fingered volunteers helping to make the afternoons a social,

fun skill-sharing experience. Over the Christmas period we will be doing special indoor festive green craft activities.

Thanks to the National Lottery Community Fund Awards for All programme we will be able to continue running these weekly sessions for the next year. The sessions run every Wednesday between 1.30-3.30 pm and are open to all. Please come and

join us, we will meet from 1.15pm in the foyer of Blaise Weston Court, and finish our sessions with free tea, coffee, biscuits and cake.

There are toilets and ample free parking on-site.

EXCITING DEVELOPMENTS AT AVONMOUTH HOUSEHOLD WASTE & RECYCLING CENTRE

Exciting work to improve Avonmouth Household Waste & Recycling Centre (otherwise known as 'the tip') will begin on Monday 2 September 2019.

The redeveloped site will have better access for residents, improved traffic flow to reduce waiting times, extra capacity to meet growing demand, improved safety and more material streams for recycling. In addition to this, the new site will also be home to Bristol's first ever reuse shop at a recycling centre. The shop will divert good quality, pre-loved items from the waste stream; providing low cost household products, such as televisions, furniture and vacuums, for residents.

By redirecting reusable items from disposal, it will reduce costs, save valuable resources and help us reach our ambitious recycling target of 50% by 2020. Profits from the sale of reusable items will be reinvested in waste reduction schemes, as well as supporting local charities. A reuse workshop will also be built into the site to support this vital work.

To enable Bristol Waste to make the changes, the opening hours for the site will be changing from Monday 2 September 2019 until the end of the year. The site will remain open to the public on Friday's, Saturdays and Sundays during the redevelopment. Extended opening hours will be in place until Monday 25 October 2019 and additional staff and capacity will be in place at the city's other Household Waste and Recycling Centre in St Philips.

To mark the site's change in focus from disposal to reuse, the site will change name to the Household Reuse and Recycling Centre. It is hoped that the changes will help Bristol increase its already impressive recycling rate, being the number one core city in England, and encourage reuse.

Tony Lawless, Managing Director, Bristol Waste Company said: "The importance of having the right infrastructure in place to help Bristol waste less and recycle more has never been clearer. We are constantly striving to develop a more sustainable city. This exciting new site, with Bristol

Waste's first ever reuse shop, will save valuable resources, offer low cost household items to local residents and help us reach our ambitious recycling target of 50% by 2020.

"We are also delighted to announce that the

improvements to the existing site will give residents reduced waiting times, better access, more materials accepted and a safer environment."

BE PART OF A BIGGER STORY WITH THE READER

Shared Reading brings books, poems and plays to life through reading aloud and group discussion.

A new shared reading group is starting in Lawrence Weston. The group will be held every Thursday at Blaise Weston Court at 10:30 – 12pm. Everyone Welcome. FREE.

How does it work?

Shared Reading groups are open to all and free to attend.

A group of people, one of them a trained Reader Leader, reads a great novel, short story or poem aloud. We stop and talk about what we have read. There is no need for group members to read aloud or speak — it's fine to just listen. The idea is to create a space where people feel at ease. Reading the literature aloud in real-time, means that everyone is involved in a shared, live experience. Group members are encouraged by the Reader Leader to respond personally, sharing feelings, thoughts and memories provoked by the reading.

The Reader is looking for people in Bristol to train to lead Shared Reading groups, to reduce social isolation and build local communities. Volunteers receive a free three-day, transformative training

course. The next course is Monday 11 – Wednesday 13 November in Bedminster.

Would you like a Warmer Home this winter for the same or less cost in heating?

From the end of October, a local scheme can show you - for free - where expensive heat is escaping. The award-winning C.H.E.E.S.E.

Project - Cold Homes Energy Efficiency Survey Experts - will be working with Ambition

Lawrence Weston to carry out internal surveys of homes using thermal imaging. They can show you how draughts may be wasting a third of the heating you buy, where insulation is missing, and where there are construction faults.

It works like this: a large fan is put in an outside doorway to reduce the internal pressure slightly. Then the surveyor videos the inside of the house with a thermal camera that shows up cold areas. You follow the survey on a tablet computer as the surveyor discusses the findings with you. A video and sound recording on a memory stick is then given to you. This shows exactly where remedial action can be taken - and that can cost as little as £50 in DIY-type remedies. The survey is also evidence that can be shown to landlords. Already the council have improved properties as a result of our surveys. Contact: https://cheeseproject.co.uk/apply-for-a-survey

Surveys are free to low-income households, and otherwise cost from £100.

Unity Sexual Health Lawrence Weston Young People's clinic

We have Moved! Due to the closure of the Ridingleaze clinic building, we have relocated on a temporary basis, hoping to join the health hub when it is ready. We have had to change the day, but will be providing the same service as before at the same times:



Wednesday afternoons: 3.15 to 6.00 at Capel Road Surgery, 46 Capel Road, BS11 ORE

We provide: contraception, including sub dermal implants; STI testing and treatment; Condoms and education; advice around unintended pregnancies, and any other issues which a young person might want to discuss around their sexual health.

Do you know the government have many options available to families to help with the costs of childcare and to offer children the opportunity to attend nursery? www.childcarechoices.gov.uk can help you decide which funding options are best. We often support parents completing forms and arranging funding so please pop in.



We want to reassure you that there are no hidden charges to pay, so a funded place will always be free. You can receive funding for eligible 2yr

olds, all 3-4yr olds up to 30hrs per a week – let us help you apply. Sometimes parents think a school nursery place is the only option, but you are able to choose other settings. Some nurseries have much smaller group sizes and offer a more homely approach giving children a gentle introduction, ready for reception class. The children graduate and all leave together for school.

As a parent/carer the decision to entrust someone else to look after your child can be difficult. We have provided something very special for families since 2000 and the setting belongs to the community and is much loved. Your baby/child needs to feel secure and loved, our long serving, settled team can offer that familiar trusted care. With nineteen years' experience the setting offers your child a different experience to traditional nurseries. The Reggio Emilia approach we follow inspires your child to feel strong, capable, resilient with a love of learning. The setting is beautifully resourced with natural items, all at child level to create a calm place that can be explored and investigated freely, both indoors and outside. Babies can curiously investigate treasure baskets and have their own outdoor safe space. Our baby room accommodates a maximum of eight under ones', offering close care and attention.

Every space in the setting is designed with the view of the child, little benches to encourage new friendships and chat (great speech development). BRIDGET'S RECEIPE

Roast side of Salmon with lemon and herb potatoes



Ingredients:

- 500g skinless and boneless side of salmon
- Low-calorie cooking spray
- 1kg miniature potatoes, scrubbed
- 3 tbsp. fat-free natural fromage frais
- 25g fresh mint leaves, chopped
- 25g fresh dill, chopped
- Zest of 1 unwaxed lemon
- 500g mix of runner beans, peas and green beans, trimmed

Preparation:

1. Preheat your oven to 220C/gas 8. line a large

baking tray with baking paper. Sit the salmon on top, skin side down, spray with low-calorie cooking spray and season. Roast for 15-20 minutes, or until lightly golden and cooked through.

- 2. While the salmon's cooking boil the potatoes for 15-20 minutes, or until tender. Drain well, then tip into a mixing bowl with the fromage frais, herbs and lemon juice. Season and toss to coat.
- 3. Meanwhile, boil the beans and peas for 2-3 minutes, or until tender, then drain. Scatter the remaining dill over the salmon, and the lemon zest over the salmon and potatoes, and serve with the veg mix topped with freshly ground black pepper.
