It has been an honour to be the chair of Directors for Ambition Lawrence Weston (ALW) for the last nine years, since my early days at Kings Weston House. The Big Local lottery grant is due to come to an end next year after 10 years of being a springboard for many and various projects in Lawrence Weston. These have included encouraging the Lidl supermarket to be built,

investment and return from a solar farm, having houses built in the area for local people, getting a community hub agreed and funded soon, as well as getting the biggest wind turbine in the country built next year - which will benefit the area for years to come I really feel we can now be proud of Lawrence Weston as it has gained a great reputation across Bristol as well as nationally. <u>Ambition Community Energy Wind Turbine Success</u>

We are pleased to announce that work will start on **your wind turbine** site 4th July 2022 with commercial operation achieved in May 2023. There won't be much to see at first as we build the access road and foundations for the turbine until the end of the year, installing the turbine in January 2023. Once built the turbine will comfortably operate for the next 25 years.

The turbine will be the tallest on-shore wind turbine in England (1 and a half Big Ben's and taller than London Eye!). It will be community owned, and all profits will go entirely to fund projects that residents decide upon via Ambition Lawrence Weston community plans which are regularly consulted with residents, even more reason to get involved as a member of Ambition Lawrence Weston to inform future community plans.

Update on Astry Close Community Led Housing - What's happening and why is the site still empty?

We have to admit that progress has been slow and it's been very frustrating. Despite winning the unanimous support of BCC's Development Committee to build 36 affordable family homes, most of the last year has been swallowed up in getting the lawyers to agree the section 106 agreement (which secures the legal commitment to deliver affordable homes) and setting up a new company to manage the homes - Ambition Community Homes. However, both of these tasks have now been completed and we are hoping to see things happening a little faster now.

You may have seen new hoarding going up around the site. Unfortunately this doesn't mean construction is about to start, but it will allow our partners (Brighter Places Housing Association) to go onto site to carry out a number of surveys and ground investigations required before it starts. We have also had a real problem with fly-tipping on the site, which is a shame because it just makes building more affordable homes slower and more expensive - so we hope the new hoarding will help discourage that.

Over the summer, the architects and structural engineers will be working hard getting the detailed technical drawings complete, ready to invite construction companies to quote for the work in the autumn. The CLH project has always sought to bring maximum benefit to the community, so we will be asking them to commit to employing local tradespeople and creating apprenticeships.

We are always looking for more local residents to join the steering group, which meets several times a year to oversee the CLH project. If you are interested, please let someone in the ALW office know or email tom@ecomotive.org




